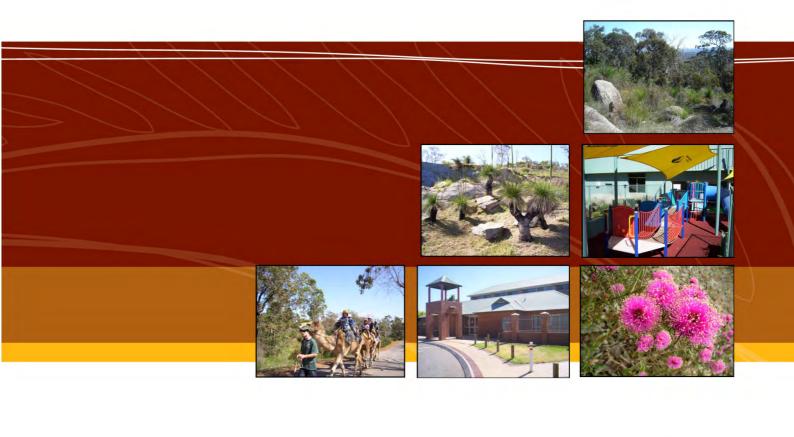

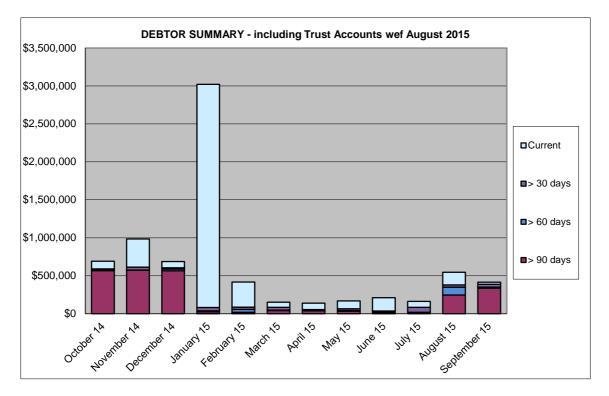

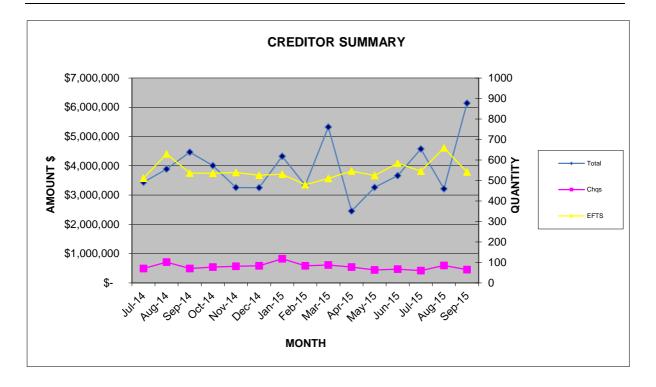

PURPOSE

1. To receive the report on rates debtors for the period ended 30 September 2015 (Attachment 1).

BACKGROUND

2. Rates notices were issued on 13 July 2015 with the following payment options:-

- 3. Rates Levied for the 2015/2016 Financial Year totalled \$31,922,663. Of this amount, approximately \$18.5 million has been collected as at 31 August 2015. A total of 22,834 Rate Notices were sent on 13 July 2015. The rates department launched three additional services to better assist ratepayers in paying their amounts due. These are:
 - A Smarter Way to Pay To date 242 ratepayers have signed up.
 - eRates To date there are 1014 properties signed up for electronic delivery.
 - BPay View To date 141 people have signed up for this service.
- 4. A total of 8,934 ratepayers have taken up an instalment option so far. Of these, 1,583 have taken up the option to pay by two instalments and 7,351 have taken up the option to pay by four instalments. A total of 12,457 ratepayers have paid in full. The due date for taking up the instalment options was 17 August 2015.
- 5. As noted on (Attachment 1), the Shire has collected \$18,564,241 or 57.54% of the debt from the date the rates and service charges were raised, compared to 54.21% at the same period last year.

This is a significant improvement of over 3% which is equivalent to over \$1 million when compared to last year.

6. Interim Rates for the 2015/2016 financial year has commenced and will be brought up to date as soon as possible.

DETAILS

Debt Recovery

- From 2012/2013 to 2013/2014 there are now nine claims outstanding with five claims waiting for a Property Seizure and Sales Order (PSSO) Land. These five properties have had rates outstanding for three years and over and all legal attempts to collect the rates has been unsuccessful. A briefing session was provided to Council on 25 May 2015. These five properties are now being passed on to the Shire's legal representatives for processing.
 - The Shire has issued 246 General Procedure Claims through the Courts for 2014/15 rates and service charges outstanding. Of these 246, the Shire has an active default judgement on 32 properties of which two are being defended. The defended properties have now been to Pre-Trial Conference with judgement being awarded to the Shire with costs. A total of 214 of these matters have been closed due to payment being received.
 - Of the 32 properties where the Shire has default judgement active, a total of 27 properties have had a PSSO – Goods issued or are awaiting issue through the Courts.
 - Debt recovery for 2015/2016 commenced on 11 September 2015. Final Notices have been sent to 1,894 ratepayers with a due date of 21 September 2015. Of these, 164 have already taken up a direct debit payment arrangement and 666 have paid in full, leaving a balance of 1,064. These will be sent to the Shire's collection agency and a Letter of Demand will be issued.

STATUTORY AND LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

8. The Shire collects its rates debts in accordance with the *Local Government Act (1995) Division 6 – Rates and Service Charges under the requirements of subdivision 5 – Recovery of unpaid rates and service charges.*

11. The early raising of rates in July has allowed the Shire's operations to commence without delays in addition to earning additional interest income.

Net Current Funding Position, note to financial statement

PURPOSE

1. To provide Council with statutory financial reports on the activity of the Shire of Kalamunda with comparison of the year's performance against adopted budget. This Statement compares the actual results for the period with the adopted budget.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The Statement of Financial Activity (Attachment 1), incorporating various sub-statements, has been prepared in accordance with the requirement of the *Local Government Act 1995, Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* (Regulation 34).
- 3. The 2014/2015 financial position is yet to be audited and finalised. As such, the opening funding position in the Statement of Financial Activity statement reflects the un-audited position and is subject to change.
- 4. The budget column reflects the adopted budget approved by Council at its meeting on 29 June 2015.

DETAILS

5. The *Local Government Act 1995* requires Council to adopt a percentage or value to be used in reporting variances against Budget. Council has adopted the reportable variances of 10% or \$50,000 whichever is greater.

Financial Commentary

Draft Statement of Financial Activity by Nature and Type for year ended 30 September 2015

6. This Statement reveals a net result surplus of \$42,545,140 against budget for the same period of \$38,241,042. The variance of \$4,304,098 represents 10.1% of the current surplus for the month to date. The majority of the variance is in capital contributions and capital expenditure categories which is due to timing issues.

Revenue

- 7. Total Revenue excluding rates is slightly under budget by \$156,351. This is made up as follows:
 - Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions are under budget by \$34,836 which is within the reporting threshold.
 - Fees and Charges variance is over budget by \$87,254. This is mainly attributable to:
 - \$145,692 for refuse collection being higher than the amount modelled. This is due to higher charges for secondary bins which are still being retained by some ratepayers. Credits are being applied for those residents who are returning the secondary waste bin and switching to a recycling bin instead.
 - Interest earnings are over budget by \$84,499. This is largely due to a timing matter and to the delays in the capital works programme, resulting in higher cash holdings and subsequent investment on short term deposits.
 - Other Revenue is slightly under budget by \$3,039. These are within the reporting threshold.

Expenditure

- 8. Total expenses are under budget with a variance of \$784,793. The significant variances within the individual categories are as follows:
 - Employment Costs are under budget by \$311,045 arising from a number of vacant positions not being filled and currently under review.
 - Materials and Contracts is under budget by \$344,161 which is comprised of:
 - Expenditure on consultancy costs of \$246,722. This relates to various non-recurrent projects which are yet to commence, such as the Forrestfield North project, which was approved by Council in late September therefore deemed as a timing issue;

- Maintenance costs related to the building asset class, this is approximately \$216,055 under expenditure which is deemed a timing issue; and
- Waste costs are under budget by \$249,473 mainly resulting from lower putrescible waste charges offset by higher verge collection costs. Finance are investigating whether there is a coding error in the invoices reflecting these variances.
- Utilities are under budget by \$35,041 which is within the reporting threshold.
- Depreciation, although a non-cash cost, is tracking under budget, reporting a variance of \$135,105. The current variance is a timing issue and is related to the finalisation of the reconciliation of the infrastructure valuation part of the final audit. However it is expected that the depreciation for infrastructure assets will need to be significantly modified to reflect the outcomes of the valuation results.
- The interest expense is slightly under budget by \$2,107, which is the result of a timing difference between amounts accrued and the budget which is based on the debenture payment schedule.
- Insurance expense is slightly under budget by \$9,281 which is due to a small number of insurance claims which are being assessed by the insurers.
- Other expenditure is over budget by \$44,081 mainly related to nonrecurrent projects caused by a timing variance. This is within the reporting threshold.

Capital Revenues

Non-operating Grants and Contributions

- 9. The non-operating grant income is higher than the budget by only \$102 as no claims have been made in the month of September.
- 10. The capital contributions of \$1,071,587 relates to stage 1 Forrestfield Industrial Area which is now managed by the Shire and funds are backed via a fully cash backed reserve. The amount reflected is what has been received in the financial year to date.

Proceeds from the disposal of assets

11. The variance is nil.

The sale of 514 Kalamunda Road was completed during the month of September 2015.

Capital Expenditures

12. Infrastructure projects, comprised roads, drainage, footpaths, car parks and parks and ovals, are underspent by \$3,409,257. The operations delivery team have been busy scheduling the various projects that are due in 2015/2016 with on ground works commencing in September 2015.

Rates revenues

13. Rates generation is over budget with a variance of \$40,127. The variance is due to a timing issue. Interim rates have commenced and should start to show progress shortly.

Draft Statement of Financial Activity by Program for the year ended 30 September 2015

14. The overall result comments are as above and generally each Program is within accepted budget except for Community Amenities and Recreation and Culture. Major variances have been reported by Nature and Type under points 7 to 12 above.

Draft Statement of Net Current Funding Position as at 30 September 2015

- 15. The commentary on the net current funding position is based on comparison of the draft September 2015 year to date actuals with September 2014 year to date actuals.
- 16. Net Current Assets (Current Assets less Current Liabilities) show a positive result of \$48.55 million. The un-restricted cash position has a positive balance of \$32.3 million which is higher than the previous year's balance of \$24.3 million. This can mainly be attributed to the rates collection and transfers from reserves in anticipation of infrastructure works projects.
- 17. Trade and other receivables comprise rates and sundry debtors totalling \$14.2 million outstanding.

The rates balance fell by \$15.99 million to \$13.7 million, representing a collection rate of 57.54% for 2015/2016 to date. This is an improvement of 3% from last year partially reflecting the successful launch of "A Smarter Way to Pay" and BPoint Enterprise which allows charging of direct debits via credit cards.

Receivables Other represents \$4.1 million with the bulk made up of:

- Emergency Services Levy (ESL) \$2,081,080;
- Waste services due \$1,363,863;
- Pensioner ESL rebates \$201,068; and
- Prepayments various make up \$269,169.
- 18. Sundry debtors have reduced by \$131,576 to \$415,271 of which \$73,898 is made up of current debt due within 30 days. A total of \$317,087 remains outstanding over 90 days for amounts due from developers related to the Forrestfield Industrial Area Stage 1 for which legal proceedings are underway to recover the amounts due.

- 19. Provisions for annual and long service leave are generally stable having increased by \$300,000 to \$2.6 million when compared to the previous year. The main reason for the increase is due to more officers being above the seven year threshold at which point long service leave entitlements begin to accrue. The Shire aggressively pursues a leave management plan that will not adversely affect service delivery. The long term goal is to bring this liability down to a more manageable level and also ensure there are adequate reserves in place to support it.
- 20. Restricted Reserves have increased significantly from \$2.6million to \$8.6million when compared to the same period in 2014.

- 3.4 To advise Council, on any changes where appropriate on the allocation of playing grounds, training times and change rooms facilities on a seasonal basis.
- 3.5 To provide guidance on future developments of the facility, inclusive of any improvements and extensions in line with changing community needs. Any such developments however, should first be approved by Council and subject to annual budget capacity.
- 3.6 To discourage misuse or vandalism of these facilities and to provide the Council with relevant information if such acts occur.

4. Membership

- 4.1 A total membership of up to cight (8) ten (10) members, all of whom shall be appointed by Council. The term of appointment shall be up to two years; however retiring members are eligible for re-nomination.
- 4.2 Membership shall include one representative from each user group of the facility or other interested people.
- 4.3 In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995, a minimum of three (3) persons must be appointed to the Committee.
- 4.4 A Councillor shall be appointed to the Advisory Committee and is empowered to rule that any matter under consideration is to be referred, via the appropriate Committee, to Council for a decision.
- 4.5 The Advisory Committee may second individuals on sub-committees and working groups, but secondments cannot be made to the main Committee.
- 4.6 The appointment of any person who is absent without leave for more than three (3) consecutive meetings shall lapse and that person will need to seek Council reappointment to continue on the Committee for the duration of its term.
- 4.7 The Presiding Person and Deputy Presiding Person shall be appointed from the body of the Committee.

5. Meetings

- 5.1 The Committee shall meet at least four (4) times in any twelve (12) months.
- 5.2 A quorum shall consist of at least one half of the appointed members being present.
- 5.3 An agenda and notice of meeting will be distributed by Council at least 7 days prior to each meeting.
- 5.4 It is important that agenda items along with any supporting papers are sent to the Secretary no later than 10 days prior to meeting. This allows time for members to consider the item and make an informed decision.
- 5.5 If there are no agenda items the Secretary in consultation with the Presiding Person will advise all members that the scheduled meeting is cancelled.
- 5.6 Late Agenda/Business items may be accepted for consideration by the committee.
- 5.7 Extraordinary meetings may be convened by the Committee Secretariat (Shire Officer) in accordance with Clause 5.3, following written requests from in excess of 50% of the current membership with voting rights.

6. Minutes

- 6.1 A Shire of Kalamunda staff member will act as Secretary for the Committee.
- 6.2 The Secretary shall keep minutes of all business transacted at all meetings and shall forward a copy of these minutes to members within 10 days of each meeting.

6.3 The Minutes to be presented to Council as an Attachment to the appropriate Standing Committee Agenda, at the next round of Council meetings following the meeting of that Committee.

7. Voting

7.1 Each appointed member present shall have one (1) vote.

8. Relationship to Council

8.1 Matters arising from the minutes of the Committee's meetings deemed of significance and/or requiring Council decision will be presented to the General Services Committee.

PURPOSE

- 1. Council consideration is sought to initiate amendments to *Local Planning Scheme No.3* (the Scheme), as follows:
 - Rezone the areas depicted on the amended map for the High Wycombe and Maida Vale, and Forrestfield and Kalamunda Housing Opportunity Precincts, in accordance with the prescribed dual density codes recommended by the Local Housing Strategy. Refer to (Attachments 1-5).
 - 2. Insert provisions into the Scheme to apply a site area per multiple dwelling standard, in lieu of plot ratio standard, for development on lots coded R40 that are not within close proximity of a commercial centre and public open space.

BACKGROUND

Dual Density Codes

- 2. The Shire is required to plan to meet the future housing needs of its residents. The Perth Metropolitan Region is growing rapidly and better use of existing urban land is needed to create a more intense metropolitan area that is functional and less expensive to service. Perth has become more diverse with new and different types of housing emerging beyond the traditional single house typology. State Government policies, particularly *Directions 2031 and Beyond,* and *Activity Centres for Perth and Peel,* are encouraging the movement toward a more efficient use of land.
- 3. The Shire's *Local Housing Strategy* (the Strategy) (Approved by Council OCM 47/2014 in March 2014) was prepared in this context. The Strategy identified several housing issues in the Shire relevant to the proposed Scheme amendment, which are summarised as follows.

4. <u>Housing Stock</u>

Single dwellings on relatively large lots (low density) comprises approximately 93.7% of the dwellings in the Shire, while grouped dwellings (units) and multiple dwellings (apartments) make up approximately 5.2% of dwellings. This indicates that the Shire has a lack of diversity of housing types compared to the rest of the Perth Metropolitan Region, even though socio-demographic characteristics are similar.

5. There is clearly a mismatch between dwelling types/sizes, and household types, with an oversupply of large dwellings, and a commensurate undersupply of smaller dwellings. This is a problem common to most suburbs of the Perth metropolitan area.

6. <u>Streetscape Character and Amenity of Residential Areas</u>

Many of the older residential areas are in need of revitalisation through the encouragement of appropriate new development. Many of the properties in High Wycombe, Maida Vale and Forrestfield with residences built in the 1960s on large lots have potential for redevelopment.

7. <u>Affordable Housing</u>

The Foothills suburbs of Maida Vale, High Wycombe and Forrestfield represent affordable value for home buyers compared to many other areas within the Perth Metropolitan Region. Most of the Foothills suburbs are either at, or below, the Perth metropolitan area average in terms of the cost of renting.

8. <u>Urban Consolidation in Existing Urban Areas</u>

While there are significant areas of undeveloped land within the Shire, it is considered that the most efficient and sustainable way for the Shire to reduce its 'ecological footprint' is to facilitate consolidation of existing urban areas – the great majority of which are occupied by low density housing. This approach is consistent with the principles associated with *Directions 2031* and *Perth and Peel 3.5 Sub-Regional Planning Framework*.

- 9. To deliver on a key recommendation of the Strategy, and provide a firm rationale for determining future housing needs in the Shire, three (3) Housing Opportunity Precincts were identified to deliver higher densities and a diverse range of housing, in the following areas:
 - High Wycombe and Maida Vale;
 - Forrestfield; and
 - Kalamunda.
- 10. Dual density codes were recommended in the Strategy as the basis for density increases around the High Wycombe and Maida Vale, Forrestfield and Kalamunda Housing Opportunity Precincts.

Multiple Dwelling Requirements in R40 Coded Areas

- 11. In July 2015, the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) announced amendments to the multiple dwelling standards of the R-Codes to apply a site area per multiple dwelling standard, in lieu of plot ratio standard for R30 coded areas. The WAPC also indicated that local governments may, through a Scheme Amendment, apply the same site area per multiple dwelling standard for development in R40 coded areas which occur outside of the following core locations:
 - Within 800m of a district centre (Kalamunda and Forrestfield);
 - Within 200m of public open space;
 - Within 400m of a local or neighbourhood centre (Edinburgh Road and High Wycombe Shopping Centres); and
 - Within 250m of a bus stop on a high frequency bus route.
- 12. The proposed Scheme Amendment will give consideration to the abovementioned locational requirements for multiple dwelling development in R40 coded areas.

DETAILS

- 13. The proposed Scheme Amendment will ultimately give effect to dual density codes within the Housing Opportunity Precincts.
- 14. A dual density code is the provision of two density codes over a lot (for example R20/R30). This Scheme Amendment proposes to retain the existing density code of each respective lot as the lower density code, and include an additional higher density code. If the Scheme Amendment is ultimately approved, both of these density codes will be superimposed on the Scheme Map over the Residential zone to which the dual density code requirements apply (as shown in Attachments 3-5).
- 15. The intent of a dual density code instrument under the proposed Scheme Amendment is to provide an incentive to develop land to achieve housing density targets outlined under the Local Housing Strategy, while facilitating development in accordance with the following objectives.
 - Promote the application of higher density codes where specific design criteria are met and set clear guidelines for infill development control through the statutory planning framework;
 - Promote orderly and proper planned infill development in appropriate areas which are close to commercial centres, community infrastructure, public transport and public open space;
 - Facilitate more diverse, affordable housing options to cater for demographic needs; and
 - To enhance urban design, streetscapes, and encourage sustainability, passive surveillance, safety and designing out crime.

16. To ensure development achieves the desired planning outcome the following provisions have been proposed to be inserted into Part 5 of the Scheme:

"5.24 Dual Density Coded Areas

5.24.1 In considering development applications for development of land within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map, the lower density shall apply to any residential development, however development at the higher code may be supported at the discretion of the Shire subject to complying with all of the following requirements:

- (a) The minimum area of the total development site being not less than 1000 square metres;
- (b) Any existing building(s) being demolished;
- (c) A stormwater drainage plan being submitted at the development application stage demonstrating that stormwater can be contained on-site;
- (d) Where the higher density code is R40 or greater, a minimum of 50% of the number of dwellings must be two (2) storeys or greater where permitted under the Residential Design Codes;
- (e) Dwelling(s) shall be designed and oriented to address the public street, right of way, communal driveway and public open space;
- (f) Landscaping being provided to enhance the development and the streetscape with the following elements:
 - (*i*) The retention of any vegetation, which in the opinion of the Shire is worthy of retention;
 - *(ii) A minimum area of 50% landscaping of the front setback area of the development site; and*
 - (iii) The provision of a street tree(s) on the verge where there is no existing street tree which in the opinion of the Shire is worthy of retention;
- (g) Where available, vehicle access shall be from a secondary street, right of way or communal access way, and the number of crossovers for any development shall be minimised;
- (h) Garages, carports and parking bays shall be integrated into the development, and where possible located behind the dwelling(s); and
- *(i)* The development shall be designed using urban design; and sustainability principles, in accordance with any relevant Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines for dual coded areas.

5.24.2 In considering subdivision applications for land within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map the Shire will only support subdivision at the higher density code where development has been constructed to plate height in accordance with a development approval."

5.24.3 In considering development applications for Aged or Dependent Persons' dwellings or Single Bedroom Dwellings within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map, the additional density bonus under the Residential Design Codes shall not be permitted at the higher density code."

- 17. Should a development proposal not satisfy all criteria set out in the Scheme and associated Local Planning Policy, the lower density will apply and development at the higher density code will not be permitted.
- 18. The areas subject to the amendment generally align with the Housing Opportunity Precincts identified under the Strategy. However, three (3) key changes have been made to the mapping for the following reasons:
 - The area south of Newburn Road within the High Wycombe and Maida Vale Housing Opportunity Precinct has been removed from the dual density code amendment (approximately 380 residential lots). This is due to the announcement of the Forrestfield-Airport Rail Link and the preparation of the Forrestfield North District Structure Plan. The appropriate density of the area omitted from this amendment has not yet been fully contemplated and further density in this location may be appropriate once planning studies have been undertaken.
 - 2. Due to changes proposed to incorporate a third runway and additional aircraft movements at Perth Airport under the Perth Airport Master Plan 2014, the Aircraft Noise Exposure Forecast (ANEF) contours will affect a greater area on the eastern portion of the High Wycombe and Maida Vale Housing Opportunity Precinct. *State Planning Policy 5.1 Land Use Planning in the Vicinity of Perth Airport* requires that for areas within the 20-25 and 25-30 ANEF contour, dwelling density should be generally limited to R20 and below. Accordingly, the areas affected by this (618 residential lots) have been removed from the proposed dual density coded areas.
 - 3. In respect to the Forrestfield Housing Opportunity Precinct, the lower density code of several residential lots south-east of Dawson Avenue will be increased from R15 to R20 to make the base density consistent with the prevailing residential density in Forrestfield. However, four lots in this precinct have a density code of R25 and will retain this as the lower density code for the purposes of this amendment.
- 19. The following dual density codes are proposed for the Housing Opportunity Precincts:

High Wycombe and Maida Vale:

- R12/R30 East of Roe Highway;
- R20/R30 South of Edney Road and Wycombe Road and a small portion east of Roe Highway.
- R20/R40 Lots immediately adjacent to Scott Reserve.
- R25/R40 North of Edney Road and Wycombe Road.
- R25/R60 Adjacent to Kalamunda Road.

Forrestfield:

- R20/R30 Existing urban areas north of Forrestfield District Centre.
- R25/R35 Lots south of Connaught Street and Jubilee Road surrounding Edinburgh Neighbourhood Centre.

- R20/R40 Areas north of Hale Road generally within 400m walkable catchment of Forrestfield District Centre.
- R25/R40 Areas south of Hale Road.
- R30/R40 Area adjacent to Woodlupine Community Centre.
- R20/R60 Lots north of Hale Road which are immediately adjacent the Forrestfield District Centre.
- R25/R60 Lots south of Hale Road which surround Forrestfield Primary School and Edinburgh Neighbourhood Centre.

Kalamunda:

- R10/R20 Lots west of Boonooloo Road and Mcrae Road.
- R10/R30 Lots south of Cotherstone Road and adjacent to Canning Road.
- R20/R40 Lots bound by Mead Street Canning Road and Railway Road.
- R30/R40 Area east of Canning Road.

20. The following table translates the proposed dual density code into the estimated number of additional dwellings at the higher code. The three (3) key changes that have been made to the Local Housing Strategy mapping which was endorsed by Council in March 2014 will result in a reduction of the estimated number of additional dwellings.

- 21. The Scheme provisions are to be read in addition to the requirements of the Residential Design Codes, Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines.
- 22. In regard to the proposed locational requirements for multiple dwelling developments in R40 codes areas, the following clause is proposed to be inserted into the Scheme:

"5.3.1 In considering an application for multiple dwellings in R40 coded areas, a site area per multiple dwelling standard, in lieu of plot ratio standard will apply, unless the development occurs within the following core areas:

- (a) Within 800m of a district centre; or
- (b) Within 400m of a local or neighbourhood activity centre.

Note: Location measurement is to be undertaken using a straight line from a central point within an activity centre boundary."

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STATUTORY AND LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015

- The *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* (Regulations) were gazetted on 25 August 2015 and will take full effect on 19 October 2015, replacing the *Town Planning Regulations 1967*.
 Accordingly, should Council resolve to initiate this Scheme Amendment, the Amendment will be processed in accordance with the new Regulations.
- 24. In relation to the processing of Scheme amendments, the Regulations distinguish 'complex', 'standard' and 'basic' types of amendments with procedural requirements for each to streamline and simplify the amendment process, particularly in relation to advertising and processing timeframes.
- 25. Under the Regulations, the proposed Scheme Amendment is considered a 'standard amendment', for the following reasons:
 - i) The proposed amendment is consistent with the objectives identified in the Scheme;
 - ii) The proposed amendment is consistent with the Shire's Local Planning Strategy and the intent of the Local Housing Strategy;
 - iii) The amendment would have minimal impact on land in the Scheme area that is not the subject of the amendment; and
 - iv) The amendment is not considered to result in significant environmental, social, economic or governance impacts on land in the Scheme area;
- 26. Should Council resolve to initiate the Amendment, it will be determined in accordance with the *Planning and Development Act 2005*. The proposal will ultimately be determined by the Minister for Planning.
- 27. It is considered that the Scheme provisions proposed are appropriate, rather than solely relying on a Local Planning Policy, as this will provide additional statutory weight in development control, particularly in the event that a proposal is the subject of a review/appeal at the State Administrative Tribunal.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Proposed Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines – Dual Density Codes

- 28. A Draft Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines will be prepared to complement the proposed Scheme provisions. The objectives of the Policy will be as follows:
 - To ensure a structured and justified approach to increasing housing density;
 - To encourage new developments to incorporate best practice design principles;

- To enhance the streetscape of existing neighbourhoods and create high amenity communities;
- To improve the function and liveability of neighbourhoods; and
- To more efficiently use existing infrastructure.
- 29. To deliver on the above objectives, the areas that will be outlined and detailed in the Policy and Guidelines will relate to the following matters:
 - Streetscape enhancement through high quality building design;
 - Environmentally sustainable and energy efficient building and lot design;
 - Water sensitive urban design;
 - Compatibility with the existing built form and character;
 - Design out crime principles through building design and passive surveillance; and
 - Vehicle access and circulation.

This policy will be presented to Council for its consideration at a later date, prior to the proposed Amendment being finalised.

- 30. The Scheme sets out the process for development and adoption of Local Planning Policies. A Policy may be made in respect to any matter relating to the planning and development of the Scheme so as to apply:
 - (a) Generally or for a particular class or classes of matters; and
 - (b) To the whole of the Scheme area or to part or parts of the Scheme area specified in the Policy.
- 31. A Local Planning Policy is not part of the Scheme and does not bind the Council in its decision making, however, Council must have regard to a Local Planning Policy to the extent that the policy is consistent with the Scheme.

Shire of Kalamunda Local Housing Strategy (2014)

- 32. The LHS sets out the strategic direction for meeting the future housing needs of its community, and for managing the character and amenity of existing residential areas.
- 33. Housing Opportunity Precincts were identified in High Wycombe and Maida Vale, Forrestfield and Kalamunda, to deliver higher densities and a diverse range of housing.
- 34. Dual density codes were recommended as the key approach is to encourage new development to contribute positively to the environment and streetscapes of the respective areas.

State Planning Policy 3.1 – Residential Design Codes

- 35. The Residential Design Codes (R-Codes) apply to any Residential zoned land that has a coding number superimposed on the Scheme Map. The core objective of the R-Codes is to ensure appropriate residential design and density in line with the Scheme.
- 36. The dual density requirements proposed under the Scheme Amendment apply in addition to the 'deemed to comply' and 'design principle' requirements of the R-Codes. Where there is an inconsistency between a requirement of the Scheme and the R-Codes, the Scheme will prevail.

Perth and Peel @ 3.5million Draft North-East Sub-Regional Planning Framework

- 37. *Perth and Peel @ 3.5million* is a strategic suite of documents that builds on *Directions 2031 and Beyond*. The draft policy has been developed to raise dialogue on what Perth City should look like in the future, particularly in relation to how increased population can be accommodated.
- 38. The North-East Sub-Regional Framework (Framework) is a spatial plan of the north-east region, which will provide guidance on strategic planning for the next 35 to 40 years.
- 39. Relevant to the proposed Scheme Amendments, the Framework is a broadbrush plan which generally seeks to:
 - Achieve more consolidated urban form;
 - Meet long-term housing requirements; and
 - Strengthen activity centres.

State Planning Policy 5.1: Land Use Planning in the Vicinity of Perth Airport

- 40. State Planning Policy 5.1 (SPP 5.1) applies to the land in the vicinity of the Perth Airport, which is, or may in the future, be affected by aircraft noise, and includes the following objectives:
 - To protect Perth Airport from unreasonable encroachment by incompatible, noise sensitive development, to provide for its ongoing development and operation.
 - To minimise the impact of airport operations on existing and future communities with reference to aircraft noise.
- 41. An area on the eastern portion of the High Wycombe and Maida Vale Housing Opportunity Precinct is affected by the 20-25 ANEF contour. SPP 5.1 requires that for areas within the 20-25 ANEF contour, dwelling density should be generally limited to R20 and below. Accordingly, the areas affected by this (approximately 540 residential lots) have been removed from the proposed dual density coded areas for the purposes of this Scheme Amendment.

Liveable Neighbourhoods

- 42. Liveable Neighbourhoods is a Western Australian Government sustainable cities initiative. It addresses both strategic and operational aspects of structure planning and subdivision development in a code framework.
- 43. The policy aims to increase support for efficiency, walking, cycling and public transport and achieving density targets amongst other matters.
- 44. 'Liveable Neighbourhoods' identifies the application of increased densities within a 400m radius of commercial centres, and a 200m radius of high frequency bus routes and District Open Space.

Affordable Housing Strategy 2010 – 2020: Opening Doors to Affordable Housing (Department of Housing)

- 45. The Affordable Housing Strategy 2010-2020 Opening Doors to Affordable Housing (Affordable Housing Strategy) is a 10-year strategic document intended to address a lack of affordable housing opportunities for low to moderate income earners in Western Australia. The Affordable Housing Strategy signifies a new government direction in housing affordability focus from public rentals to stakeholder collaboration to increase the range of housing options and solutions available to those facing housing stress.
- 46. Critically, the Affordable Housing Strategy also emphasises the importance of housing strategies in informing town planning schemes and facilitating the delivery of dwelling diversity in local areas, as is proposed through the dual density coding provisions of the Scheme.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 47. The *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* establish the advertising procedure for amendments to Schemes. As the proposed amendment is considered a 'standard amendment', should Council initiate the amendment, it will be required to be formally advertised for a minimum period of 42 days.
- 48. Given the significance of the proposed amendments in terms of potential effects on development patterns in the Shire, it is recommended that advertising be undertaken for a period of 60 days, including community forums in each of the Housing Opportunity Precincts.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

49. Any costs associated with the preparation of the amendment document and Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines, and undertaking public advertising will be met through the Development Services budget.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN

Strategic Planning Alignment

50. Kalamunda Advancing: Strategic Community Plan to 2023

OBJECTIVE 4.2 – To effectively plan for the diverse range of housing stock that will be required to meet the social and economic needs of the Shire's changing demographics.

- Strategy 4.2.1 Facilitate the delivery through strategies and policy development of a diverse range of housing within the Shire to ensure inclusiveness in population accommodation.
- Strategy 4.2.2 Facilitate the delivery of suitable housing options for the aged population and people with special needs through a range of smaller and affordable homes and unit dwellings.

OBJECTIVE 4.3 – To ensure the Shires development is in accord with the Shires statutory and legislative obligations and accepted urban design planning standards.

Strategy 4.3.1 Provide efficient building and development approval services to the community.

SUSTAINABILITY

Social Implications

- 51. A key objective of the implementation of dual density codes is to facilitate a range of diverse housing types for the community.
- 52. The demolition of older housing stock and redevelopment at the higher density code will result in a higher level of amenity to streetscapes and the 'whole of site' improvements.

Economic Implications

- 53. The Scheme Amendment aims to encourage resource-efficient development with the aim of promoting affordable housing.
- 54. Increased levels of development as a consequence of the dual density codes will result in more jobs for the building and construction industry.

Environmental Implications

55. The Scheme amendment encourages environmentally sustainable and energy efficient building design, water sensitive urban design, and enhanced streetscape amenity.

56. Redevelopment of properties in the dual density coded areas will result in new housing with higher sustainability standards (eg. Green Star Rating).

OFFICER COMMENT

- 58. Dual density codes are broadly accepted as a technique for facilitating the transition from lower density established residential areas into medium and high density development.
- 59. The proposed dual density coded areas will guide urban consolidation in appropriate areas, consistent with the strategic policy position of the State Government, in providing for population growth in areas with good access to transport, close to commercial centres and service infrastructure.
- 60. The provisions proposed under the Scheme Amendment aim to influence the fundamental factors that contribute towards the character and amenity of a residential area, such as:
 - The quality and condition of dwellings;
 - Block sizes and dwelling density;
 - Quality landscaping;
 - Vehicle access requirements;
 - Walkability and connectivity to commercial centres, public transport, community facilities and public open space; and
 - A sense of safety and security.
- 61. Dual density code provisions have been proposed within the Scheme to give the provisions additional statutory weight and strengthen the Shire's position if a proposal is challenged through the SAT. The provisions will also facilitate consistent and transparent decision making.
- 62. In addition, a draft Local Planning Policy will be prepared which elaborates on key criteria required to be complied with to allow for the redevelopment of properties at the higher density coding and provide housing choice for a range of demographic groups.

- 63. It is noted that the Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines will need to illustrate appropriate design outcomes expected. These will be prepared and presented to Council for its consideration prior to the final adoption of the proposed Scheme amendment.
- 64. The proposed Scheme Amendment is considered to address a key objective of the LPS, the Strategy and relevant policies. Accordingly, it is recommended that Council initiate the Scheme amendment.

Resolved that the local government pursuant to section 72 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005*, amend the above Local Planning Scheme by:

1. Inserting the following new sub-clause 5.3.1 and renumbering the remaining clauses accordingly:

"5.3.1 In considering an application for multiple dwellings in R40 coded areas, a site area per multiple dwelling standard, in lieu of plot ratio standard will apply, unless the development occurs within the following core areas:

- (a) Within 800m of a district centre; or
- (b) Within 400m of a local or neighbourhood activity centre.

Note: Location measurement is to be undertaken using a straight line from a central point within an activity centre boundary."

2. Inserting the following clause:

"5.24 Dual Density Coded Areas

5.24.1 In considering development applications for development of land within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map, the lower density shall apply to any residential development, however development at the higher code may be supported at the discretion of the Shire subject to complying with all of the following requirements:

- (a) The minimum area of the total development site being not less than 1,000 square metres;
- (b) Any existing building(s) being demolished;
- (c) A stormwater drainage plan being submitted at the development application stage demonstrating that stormwater can be contained on-site;
- (d) Where the higher density code is R40 or greater, a minimum of 50% of the number of dwellings must be two (2) storeys or greater where permitted under the Residential Design Codes;
- (e) Dwelling(s) shall be designed and oriented to address the public street, right of way, communal driveway and public open space;
- (f) Landscaping being provided to enhance the development and the streetscape with the following elements:
 - (i) The retention of any vegetation, which in the opinion of the Shire is worthy of retention;
 - (ii) A minimum area of 50% landscaping of the front setback area of the development site; and
 - (iii) The provision of a street tree(s) on the verge where there is no existing street tree which in the opinion of the Shire is worthy of retention;
- (g) Where available, vehicle access shall be from a secondary street, right of way or communal access way, and the number of crossovers for any development shall be minimised;
- (h) Garages, carports and parking bays shall be integrated into the development, and where possible located behind the dwelling(s); and
- (i) The development shall be designed using urban design and sustainability principles, in accordance with any relevant Local Planning Policy and Design Guidelines for dual coded areas.

5.24.2 In considering subdivision applications for land within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map the Shire will only support subdivision at the higher density code where development has been constructed to plate height in accordance with a development approval."

5.24.3 In considering development applications for Aged or Dependent Persons' dwellings or Single Bedroom Dwellings within the dual coded areas depicted on the Scheme Map, the additional density bonus under the Residential Design Codes shall not be permitted at the higher density code."

3. Recoding the designated areas of High Wycombe and Maida Vale, Forrestfield and Kalamunda with dual density codes and amending the Scheme Map accordingly. 2. Subject to amendment documents being prepared, the documents being adopted by Council and the Amendment being formally advertised for 60 days in accordance with the provisions of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.*

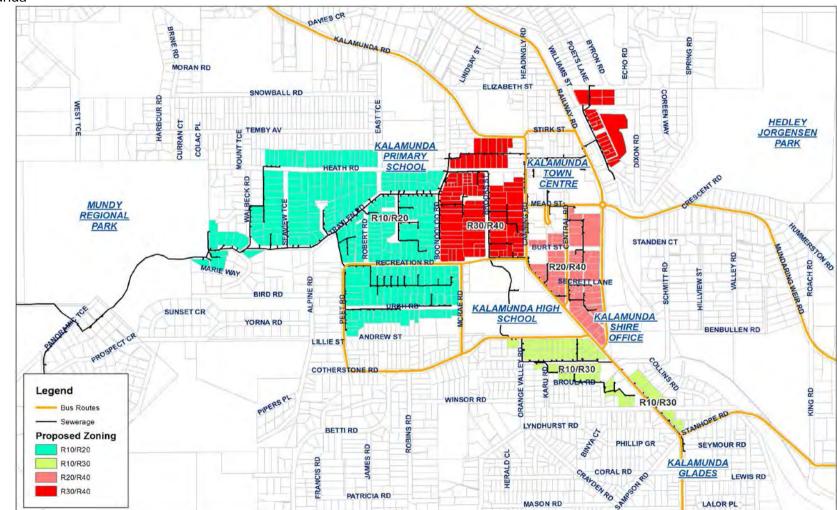

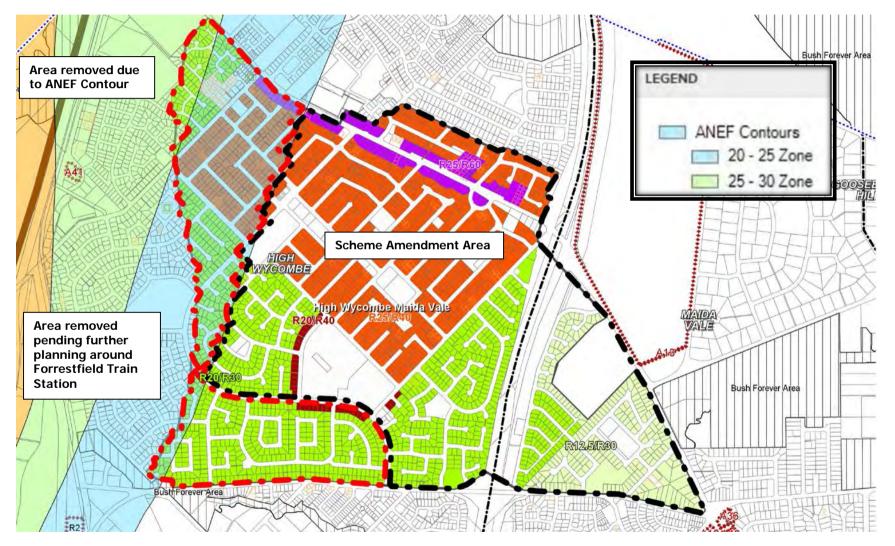

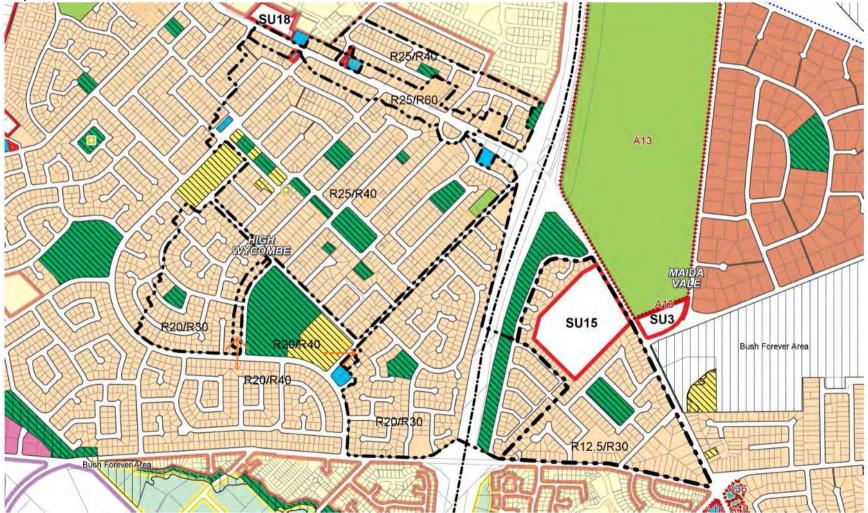

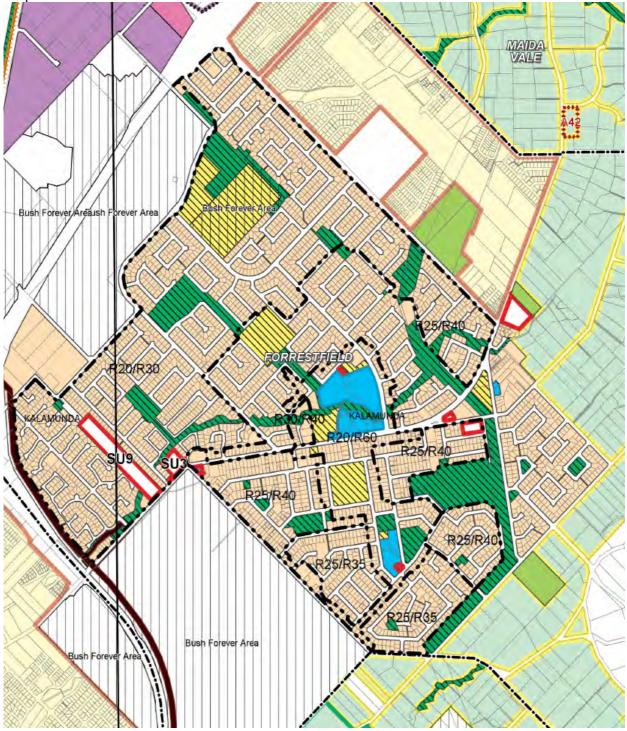
Local Planning Scheme No. 3 Amendment – Dual Density Codes Existing and Proposed Scheme Map – Forrestfield

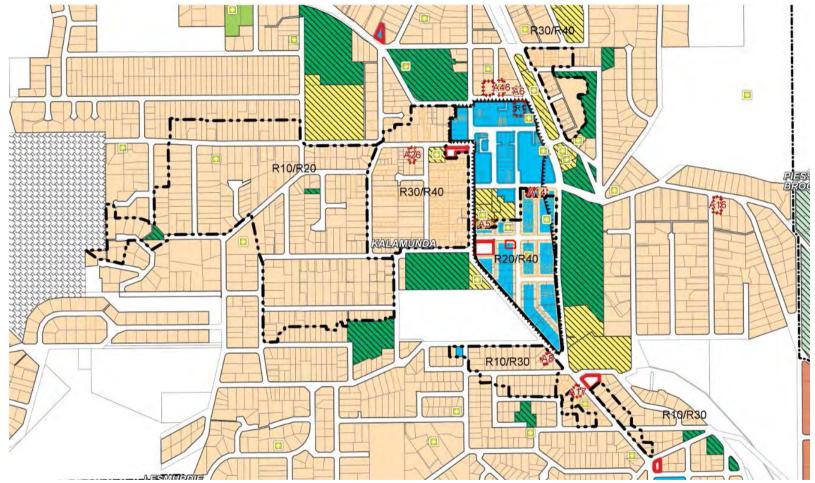

PURPOSE

1. To consider the reallocation of unexpended funds from the Hartfield Park Rugby Fields Sports Lighting Project to bring forward the start of the parking and pathways component of the Financial Assistance Grant Deliverables.

BACKGROUND

- 2. On 28 January 2014, the State of Western Australian represented by the Minister for Sport and Recreation and the Shire of Kalamunda executed a Financial Assistance Agreement (the Agreement) for the provision of a \$6.01 million grant for the staged implementation of projects incorporated in the Hartfield Park Masterplan.
- 3. The Agreement provides for the deliverables to be completed in three stages by 28 January 2017, with the Shire's Capital Works Budget and project programming based on meeting this timeframe.
- 4. The grant is to be paid by instalments based upon the achievements of the following milestones:

DETAILS

- 5. In accordance with Delegation No. LGA2 of the Delgations Register Tenders and Expressions of Interest – Awarding of Tenders up to \$250,000, the Chief Executive Officer accepted the tender from Hender Lee on 28 August 2015 for the lump sum price of \$222,979.63 – Tender RFT 1509 for the Rugby Field Lighting Upgrades.
- 6. The total estimated cost of these works, including the tender price, overheads, professional fees, parks remedial works and contingencies is \$316,250.
- 7. The 2015/2016 budget for Job No. 4442 Hartfield Park Rugby Field Lighting Upgrades is \$529,232. This figure included an amount of \$74,000 for Western Power headworks costs for site power supply upgrades which were completed and paid for in 2014/2015.
- 8. Unexpended funds of \$212,982 on Job No. 4442 are available for reallocation to other deliverables included in the Agreement.

STATUTORY AND LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

9. State Government funding for the Hartfield Park Redevelopment Project must be expended on the deliverables outlined in the Agreement.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 11. Extensive community engagement was conducted as part of the development of the Hartfield Park Masterplan, including discussions with all clubs based at the reserve, relevant State Associations, neighbouring Local Government Authorities and Local Schools. A detailed community survey and workshops were also held.
- 12. The Hartfield Park Masterplan was adopted by Council at its meeting on 16 August 2010 (OCM 110/2010 refers) and used as the basis of defining the deliverables as part of the Agreement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 13. The adopted Final Hartfield Park Masterplan shows a number of proposed parking and pathway projects which currently are programmed for construction in 2016/2017.
- 14. The Agreement allows for an Instalment Amount of \$2,755,000 to be paid upon evidence of commencement of Stage 3 which includes the development of new car parking areas and new pathway networks.

15. There is a financial incentive for Council to reallocate the unexpended funds from Job No. 4442 to Hartfield Park Car Parking and Pathway Projects to enable these works to commence in 2015/2016 and an invoice submitted for payment of Stage 3 of the funding in line with the Agreement.

PURPOSE

1. To consider a nomination for a Development Assessment Panel (DAP) member for the Metro East Region following the defeat of one of the current members at the 2015 Local Government Elections.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The *Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panels) Regulations* 2011 (DAP Regulations) commenced on 24 March 2011. DAPs commenced operation on 1 July 2011. Nominees are appointed for a two-year term, with current appointments expiring on 26 April 2017.
- 3. A DAP comprises a mix of three technical experts and two local government representatives with the power to determine applications for development approval in place of the relevant decision maker. The local government representatives will only be required to sit on a DAP when the application is for a development in their local government area.

DETAILS

- 4. The DAP Regulations require local governments to submit to the Minister nominations for DAP members. Local governments have until 30 October 2015 to submit their nominations of changes following the 2015 Local Government Elections.
- 5. One of the Council's current DAP members, (ex-Cr) Justin Whitten was defeated at the 2015 Local Government Elections.

The other current Members and Alternate Members are: Member – Cr Sue Bilich Alternate Members – Crs Dylan O'Connor and Simon Di Rosso

6. The replacement DAP member will be appointed for the balance of the current term expiring on 26 April 2017. All members are required to attend a training workshop on Planning Law and Codes of Conduct.

- 7. It will be mandatory to refer a development proposal which has a total value of more than \$10 million to a DAP for determination. Exclusions to this mandatory requirement are for a single house, less than 10 grouped or multiple dwellings and development by the local government or WA Planning Commission.
- 8. When an application is lodged with the Shire, which has a value between \$2 million and \$10 million, the applicant may nominate it be determined by a DAP rather than the responsible authority.
- 9. It is anticipated that DAPs will meet fortnightly or monthly, dependent upon the number of applications to be determined.

10. The *Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panels) Regulations 2010* provide for the operation, constitution and administration of DAPs.

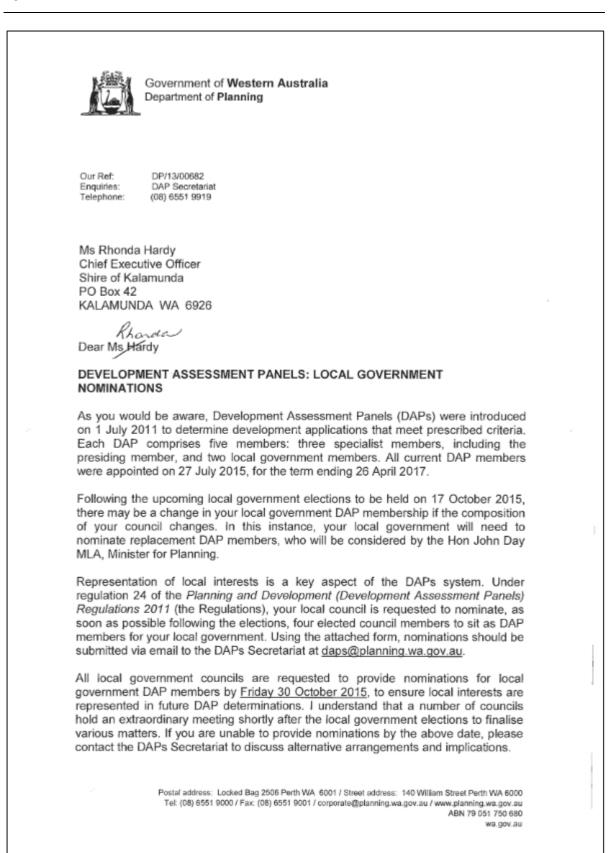

13.1 <u>Cr Justin Whitten – Increase in Parks and Gardens Maintenance Crews</u>

- Q. Could the Shire pleases investigate the cost associated with additional Parks and Gardens Maintenance Crews? Residents have commented to me that parks in the South West Ward are not on par with other areas within the Shire.
- A. The annual cost for a horticultural crew (3 person) is \$469,625 broken down as follows:

Labour cost	\$173,780
Plant costs	\$101,920
Materials and contract costs	\$100,000
Sub-total	\$375,700
Overheads (25%)	\$93,925
Total	\$469,625

Further to this, the maintenance standards are based on the Reserve Category. An analysis of the number of hectares in each Reserve Category for selected suburbs is summarised below:

The reserves in Wattle Grove are non-reticulated open space and are therefore categorised as Category 2 and 3 reserves. As the open space areas in Wattle Grove develop, it is likely that reticulation will be installed, allowing them to be classified as Category 1 reserves.

In order to reticulate these reserves, the capital cost is in the order of \$6 per square metre, so we would be looking at an overall capital investment of \$582,000 for the current Category 2 Reserves and \$432,000 for the current Category 3 reserves in Wattle Grove.

13.2 <u>Cr Justin Whitten – Street Lighting between Hale Road & Tonkin Highway</u>

- Q. Could the Shire please investigate and report on the adequacy of the street lighting along Welshpool Road East, between Hale Road and Tonkin Highway? I have reports that there are a number of areas along this stretch of road which requires attention.
- A. The section of Welshpool Road between Roe Highway and Tonkin Highway is the responsibility of Main Roads. An investigation has highlighted there are limited street lights in this section and therefore inadequate lighting of the road and ancillary areas such as footpaths.

A letter has been sent to Main Roads to investigate the issue and provide a report to the shire on the program to upgrade the street lighting to Australian Standard AS 1158.
