Reasons for those who advises they did not support were-

- The whole process is unnecessarily complicated.
- I believe the time money and energy could be utilised for a different cause or issue.
- I don't support dual naming of places that are significant and do not warrant such a dual naming.

Reasons for those who advised they did support the policy were:

- I think that having it open to the residents being able to put suggestions forward is encouraging. The policy seems to cover many aspects that I would agree with.
- The City needs some clear guidelines for naming. Far too many parks and reserves in the City are named after former Councillors.
- We should be recognising our local people and places more. This gives us the opportunity to do so to a greater degree.
- Recognition traditional owners, keeping noongar language relevant.
- The policy reflects current views of the general community, and goes toward more harmonisation of relationships, and future interaction, between all parties that have had a positive impact on lifestyles, attitudes and social standings.
