


Annual Meeting of Electors

1. Official Opening

The Presiding Member opened the meeting at 6:40pm and welcomed Councillors, Staff, Members of the Public and those watching via live stream. The Presiding Member also acknowledged the Traditional Owners of the land on which we meet the Whadjuk Noongar people.

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3. Presentation and Discussion of 2023/2024 Annual Report

3.1 The Presiding Member presented the Annual Report for 2023/24 to the meeting. The Presiding Member welcomed Chief Executive Officer, Anthony Vuletta, who joined the City in June 2024, she also thanked Gary Ticehurst and Nathan Ritchie for their efforts whilst in the acting CEO position.

4. General Business

4.1 <u>RESOLVED AGM 2025 /1</u>

I move that the City of Kalamunda be made aware of widespread community dismay and disapproval of the proposed development of a McDonald's restaurant and car wash for a property on the corner of Canning and Heath roads in Kalamunda. There are multiple reasons to be unhappy about this inappropriate development for our town Centre including the following points.

- 1. The proposal fails to meet multiple City of Kalamunda Local Planning Policies.
- 2. The development will adversely impact townsite parking, traffic volumes and flow, further contributing to the problematic intersection of Heath and Canning Roads. The application does not satisfy due diligence regarding the impacts of this increased traffic volume, heavy vehicle activity, traffic flow and pedestrian / cyclist safety when considering the future impacts on the community. Notably, the application provides insufficient traffic impact evidence regarding the current crosswalk and omits data during current peak traffic times including peak school traffic periods.
- 3. The proposed development is within close proximity to 2 schools (Kalamunda Primary School & Kalamunda Senior School), a daycare centre and is at odds with community health, WA's Sustainable Health Review and the WA Health Promotion Strategic Framework.

4.5	<u>Adele Standeven</u> Ms Standeven queried the time provided to speakers when addressing the meeting.
	The Presiding Member advised it was at the discretion of the Presiding Member as to the allocation of speaking time. It was noted by the Presiding Member the time of 2 minutes was provided in fairness to the large crowd who may wish to speak on matters raised.
