#### Purpose

This Community Engagement Plan is intended as a broad coverage of all exercises and messaging carried out throughout a continuous 12-month period, aimed at bushfire preparedness for the City of Kalamunda community.

### Background

The City of Kalamunda is uniquely placed in the Darling Ranges, with the region being renowned for its beautiful Jarrah and Marri forests, walking trails and native flora and fauna. The natural beauty of the region however, significantly increases the area's risk to bushfire. As such the City of Kalamunda, aim to prepare and protect its community through the implementation of a proactive community engagement strategy, to educate and empower community members to confidently prepare, safely respond to, and recover from bushfire.

Bushfires have the capacity to strike without warning and provided with the right environmental conditions, can quickly exceed firefighting resources. Bushfires greatly impact community, properties, homes and infrastructure, while posing great risk to human life. It is for this reason, that it is imperative that both the wider community, households and individuals are supported in engagement of bushfire preparedness, awareness and survival planning. This is crucial for the City of Kalamunda to protect life, livelihood, property and community.

This engagement approach will aim to directly promote and improve upon current bushfire preparedness, increase the number of family bushfire survival plans and help the community understand and accept its risk to the impact of bushfire. Engaging the community will form valuable connections within the community itself, improving overall preparedness, resilience and incident recovery. Care must be taken not to assume that merely providing information will facilitate the adoption of preventative measures, as this is largely not the case. For this reason, an interactive and collaborative engagement plan must be incorporated in this strategy.

Facilitating personable and interactive engagement activities, involving skilled bushfire control officers, experienced and knowledgeable fire fighters with community members, allows individuals to connect, exchange information, educate and share personal experiences of bushfire.

This exchange is critical in establishing realistic and informed acceptance and understanding of personal risk and responsibility at both an individual and community level.

It is important that individuals do not assume that the City will be wholly responsible for hazard preparedness and mitigation, they must take personal responsibility for their property and family. Also critically important is to dispel the belief that fire authorities would protect individual homes during a bushfire. Education, acceptance of personal responsibility and informed self-reliance are critical to ensure self-protection of residents during bushfires and to support the protective services provided by local and career fire services.

Collaborative engagement creates networking opportunities between neighbours, community services and community members. It also provides reassurance that there are other people within the community, who like themselves, are proactive, informed, and vigilant of their surroundings and who have prepared their property and family in the event of bushfire. The greater the number if prepared properties improves the resilience of the community.

Property preparedness should be promoted on an ongoing basis, throughout the year. Adopting this approach will also assist community members to prepare their property for the impact of winter storms, as well as reducing the scale of works required prior to fire season. This maintenance program becomes easier for people to maintain, rather than one off, large scale works in the heat of the summer months, prior to the holiday and Christmas season.

Engagement focussing on bushfire awareness, preparedness and planning should be facilitated from September through until end to March (Extended through April should weather summer weather conditions extend).

#### Communications and Engagement Objectives

This plan will aim to:

- 1. Raise **awareness** of the risk of bushfire, **improve preparedness** levels and instigate the completion of bushfire survival plans, utilising the DFES 5 Min Fire Chat and Smart Burn Toolkits, in addition to educational presentations and activities in association with local Emergency Services to community.
- 2. Create an understanding of the behaviour of fire and change risky behaviour/apathy in community.
- 3. Form acceptance of personal risk associated with bushfire in The City of Kalamunda
- 4. Gain acceptance that it is the community member's personal responsibility to prepare property and protect family.
- 5. Influence the **perception and attitude** in among 60% of stakeholders that the City has achieved equitable levels of engagement and improved hazard prevention practices from residents across the districts in the City, through:
  - 1. Monthly shopping centre engagement booths
  - **2. Newspaper advertisements:** covering statutory announcements, as well as advertising and promotional notices.
  - 3. Digital media engagement
  - **4. Bushfire Survey:** By surveying members of the community and capturing people's views on how they make choices about preparing, this engagement strategy aims to gain the community perspective to provide a strong framework for future engagement, planning, intervention and design.
  - **5. Seniors bushfire awareness engagement booth:** Senior citizens living within the City of Kalamunda can be a vulnerable community in the case of a bushfire emergency. It is important that they are engaged with on a topical level to help prepare them for such a situation.
  - **6. Outreach telephone engagement:** By directly calling all previous recipients of a 2019-2020 work order or infringement prior to the commencement of the bushfire season, the City can help to ensure that they are ready and prepared adequately for the oncoming season.
  - **7. Smart Burn event:** Providing a live demonstration of spring burning, with all protocols and safety demonstrations. This will allow members of the community to learn about smart burning practises in a safe and interactive environment.
  - **8. Street Meets:** in key areas (high risk) to share with these residences the need for preparing and protecting their property (City Regulations APZ) planning their household's survival plan (Fire Chat Toolkit). Incorporate local BFR Groups and local volunteer bushfire brigades.
  - **9. RUI Event:** the City will be running a RUI type exercise involving the City of Kalamunda, Career and Volunteer FRS, Bush Fire Brigade, Bush Fire Ready Group and DFES regional staff.
  - **10.** bushfire brigade open day: this will be a flagship event to encourage a community gathering for the purposes of educating and supporting the City's residences to help prepare them for the upcoming bushfire season.
  - **11. Farmers Market**: To engage with the community at a place where they are naturally gathered. This places less emphasis on the City staff to organise and coordinate community members to attend a bushfire preparedness event.

#### 12. Supporting the Kalamunda Bushfire Ready Group

#### Aim and Purpose

The City of Kalamunda aims to prepare and protect its community through the implementation of a proactive community engagement strategy, to educate and empower community members to confidently prepare, safely respond to, and recover from bushfire. The greater the number of prepared properties improves the resilience of the community. It also provides reassurance that there are other people within the community, who like themselves, are proactive, informed, and vigilant of their surroundings and who have prepared their property and family in the event of bushfire.

Purpose of this plan is to effectively engage with the community in wanting to create the desired change in behaviour and attitude with our engagement focussing on bushfire preparedness, planning and awareness. City of Kalamunda want to foster a collaborative engagement that creates networking opportunities between neighbours, community services and community members under the one banner of a shared responsibility.

- Improve community resilience by way of a redesigned the Fire Hazard Reduction Notice promoting compliance understanding.
- Provide a community engagement schedule prior to commencement of "fire season" (October to May) to help educate the importance of preparedness and give the community the opportunity to ask important question about their preparedness before the start of the fire season.
- Identifying and targeting high risk groups and areas for planning a strategic approach to conducting effective fire hazard assessments to give them assistance in helping themselves to prepare for the upcoming fire season.

The community engagement plan is adapted each year based on community feedback, emergency incidents that occur, DFES campaigns, other agency campaigns, FCO's and the community safety team's observations and data.

#### Limitations

Community engagement may be limited by resources, financial restrictions, and the scale of the area to reach through engagement and communication. Influencing these factors may be beyond the capacity of the City.

However, the City where possible can influence these to achieve improved outcomes that enhance storm and bushfire preparedness through a range of approaches such as but not limited to:

- Collaboration with other community groups and stakeholders
- Workshops and events.
- Creating a continuing community engagement and communication plan based on community feedback and the changing climate.
- Providing engaging online content

It is also recognised the limitations brought forward may be due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus COVID-19 and the plan will adopt any contingencies along with ensuring all directions are followed issued from the State government

#### Key Messages

# Burn SMART Community Demonstration

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services is delivering a Burn SMART live demonstration for the City of Kalamunda community.

Under the Bush Fires Act 1954, the City of Kalamunda issues a Fire Hazard Reduction Notice that require landholders or occupiers of land to install and maintain firebreaks and reduce fuel areas around their boundaries and assets. This is to help prevent the start or spread of a bushfire. The requirements of these firebreak or hazard reduction notices vary depending on the size of the property.

Planned burning is the deliberate burning of a pre-determined area under the right environmental conditions to reduce fuel loads. Planned burns are done under mild and stable weather conditions so that the fire burns slowly and with low flame heights. Planned burning is just one of several methods used to reduce fuel loads. Other methods include raking, slashing, ploughing and weed control. When combined, these methods can:

- Maximise the effectiveness of your fuel management
- Reduce the impact of bushfire
- Assist in protecting life and property

Done properly, planned burning is an efficient way to remove the build-up of fuel over larger areas of land where other methods are too labour intensive.

Used appropriately, a planned burn not only helps to safeguard lives and property in the event of a bushfire, but generally results in less environmental disturbance than other methods, benefiting many native plants and animals.

Smart Burn Objectives:

- 1. The Burn Smart campaign aims to educate community members about planned burning on private land. Planned burning on private property is essential part of reducing the bush fire risk, however escaped burns increase the risk of impacting property and lives and put a strain on firefighting resources.
- 2. To provide landowners better understanding of planned burning and reduce the risk of their burns escaping.
- 3. Provide the community with the tools to make decisions on the most effective method to mitigate their risk of bushfire.
- 4. Achieve compliance with the City of Kalamunda's Fire Hazard Reduction Notice 2020-2021.
- 5. Assess the preparedness of the local community.

The City of Kalamunda is uniquely placed in the Darling Ranges, with the region being renowned for its beautiful Jarrah and Marri forests, walking trails and native flora and fauna. The natural beauty of the region however, significantly increases the area's risk to bushfire. As such, The City of Kalamunda aim to prepare and protect its community through the implementation of a proactive community engagement strategy, to educate and empower community members to confidently prepare, safely respond and improve recovery, if impacted by bushfire.

Bushfires have the capacity to strike without warning and provided with the right environmental conditions, can quickly exceed firefighting resources, devastating community, properties, and infrastructure, while posing great risk to the loss of human life.

It is for this reason, that it is imperative that both the wider community and individual households are supported in engaged in bushfire preparedness, awareness and survival planning. If you've not yet joined your local Bushfire Ready Group we encourage you to do so! Bushfire Ready is a local community action program aimed at encouraging local residents to work together in preparing and protecting their families and properties against bushfires.

The benefits of forming a Bushfire Ready group include:

• Increasing your understanding of bushfire risk around homes, streets and the immediate surrounding bush land in your area

- Support for developing your own Bushfire Survival Plan
- Opportunities for meeting neighbours to develop support networks that may be needed in a bushfire emergency

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 (WA), the City of Kalamunda gives you written notice to act as specified in this notice to land that you own and/or occupy and with respect to any matter which is upon the land that you own and/or occupy situated within the district of the City of Kalamunda.

Failure or neglect to comply with the requisitions of this notice is an offence and can result in a penalty of up to \$5000. The City of Kalamunda gives you notice that its officers, servants, workmen, contractors, vehicles, machinery and appliances (as the officers deem fit) may enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of this notice that are not complied with by the time specified in the notice, and the amount of any costs and expenses incurred may be recovered from you as the owner and/or occupier of the land

#### ALL LAND WITH A TOTAL AREA OF 4000m2 OR MORE

#### ☐ FIRE-BREAKS

Install or upgrade a 3-metre-wide by 4-metre-high clearance, bare mineral earth, continuous (no dead ends) trafficable fire-break as close as possible inside the entire perimeter of the land. A reticulated and maintained green lawn may be accepted in lieu of a firebreak.

#### ☐ DEAD FLAMMABLE MATERIAL

Maintain all dead flammable material below 8 tonne per hectare (see definition fuel load).

#### SLASHING

Dead grass, shrubs and plants shall be slashed, mowed, or trimmed down to a height no greater than 50mm across the entire property.

#### ASSET PROTECTION ZONE (APZ)

Maintain a fuel reduced zone around all buildings or assets of value which extends 20 metres from the outermost point of the building or asset.

- » Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter.
- Fuel load within the 20 metres shall be reduced and maintained to no more than 2 tonne per hectare

#### ALL LAND WITH A TOTAL AREA LESS THAN 4000m2

#### DEAD FLAMMABLE MATERIAL

Maintain all dead flammable material below 8 tonne per hectare (see definition fuel load).

#### SLASHING

Dead grass, shrubs and plants shall be slashed, mowed, or trimmed down to a height no greater than 50mm across the entire property.

#### CLEAN GUTTER DEBRIS

Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter

#### VARIATION TO THE FIRE HAZARD REDUCTION NOTICE

If you consider, for any reason, that it is impractical to meet the requirements as per this notice, you may apply in writing for a variation to the requirements of this notice to the City of Kalamunda by no later than 1 October 2020, to request authorisation to employ other methods of fire prevention to land that you own and/or occupy. An administration fee of \$150 applies for applications received after 1 October 2020.

If permission is not granted to you for a variation of this notice, you must comply with the requirements outlined in the Fire Hazard Reduction Notice.



#### SMART BURN Event A4 Flier:



Reducing fuel increases the chances of your property surviving a bushfire. The more fuel available to a bushfire, the hotter the fire can burn and the harder it is to control. Flammable material such as leaf litter, fallen branches, dead grasses and shrubs provide fuel for fire, allowing it to grow more quickly and burn at higher temperatures.

Reduced fuel levels assist not only in reducing how quickly a fire can spread, but it also reduces its spotting distance (how far the fire can jump).





## Be ready by November 1

- As a measure to assist in the control of bushfires and pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, property owner and/or occupier of the land within the City of Kalamunda, are required before 1 November to comply with the conditions as specified in the annual Fire Hazard Reduction Notice. This can be found at www.kalamunda.wa.gov.au/fire.
- The applicable works as outlined in the annual Fire Hazard Reduction Notice must be completed before 1November annually and maintained up and to including 31 March the following year.
- VARIATIONS
   If you consider it impractical to clear or construct firebreaks and/or carry out other fire prevention work in accordance with the City of Kalamunda Fire Hazard Notice, you must apply in writing to the City of

Kalamunda to seek permission of variation.

Requests for variations must be submitted before 1 October every year.

A firebreak is a 3-metre-wide, bare mineral earth, Continuous and trafficable. A firebreak must not have any combustible materials present and must have a height clearance of 4 metres minimum. A firebreak is used for firefighting operations and access for fire appliances in the event of an incident, it also a means to assist reduce the spread offire. These breaks must be in a continuous, trafficable form meaning a large vehicle can drive continuously within the perimeter of the

There are many ways to achieve the requirements and the City suggests seeking professional advice from a contractor. The City does not provide a contractors list to residents, however these can be found online and within local directories.

If it is deemed impracticable to clear or construct firebreaks you must apply in writing to the City of Kalamunda to seek permission of Variation. Please refer to www.kalamunda.wa.gov.au/fire for more information.

#### A firebreak is:

- To a width of 3 metres wide
- To a height clearance of 4 metres
- Bare mineral earth
- Continuous and trafficable
- Free of combustible materials

## Example of an Urban Property with an Asset Protection Zone - Best Practice

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) is an area extending

20 metres from the furthest point around a building where there is reduced flammable material. This means there is less material that can catch fire, improving the defendability of a property.

- Maintain a fuel reduced zone around all buildings or assets of value which extends 20 metres from the outermost point of the building or asset and maintained to no more than 2 tonne per hectare. Dead grass, shrubs and plants shall be slashed, mowed, or trimmed down to a height no greater than 5cm across the entire property. Ensure gutters, roofs and walls of buildings are free of flammable matter.
- Trees over 5 metres in height must be under pruned up to 2 metres off the ground.
- Trees or shrubs within 2 metres of the asset must be pruned so that they have an overall height of no greater than 2 metres.

# Property Preparedness - Best Practice

#### **Bushfire Plan**

- The City of Kalamunda faces a significant bushfire risk. It is highly recommended that all residents implement a Bush Fire Plan and check annually.

#### Livestock

 If you have livestock on a property in a high-risk area, consider either moving them to a safer location during the fire season or leaving them in well-grazed paddocks with supplementary feed.

#### Water Supply and Pumps

 If you choose to stay and defend your home, you need to have an independent water supply and pumping capability ready as scheme water may not be available due to infrastructure damage, power cuts or firefighting activity.

#### **Total Fire Ban**

Total Fire Bans (TFBs) are declared by DFES based on weather conditions and firefighting capability. It is declared by the Minister for Emergency Services on advice from DFES.

The ban includes all open camp fires for the purpose of cooking or camping. It also includes incinerators, welding, grinding, soldering or gas cutting.

An exemption may be granted if you can show you are taking proper steps to prevent any fire spreading, and can control and put out any fire that may start.

Exemptions can cover specific times and locations and can be changed or cancelled at any time.

### Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans

A Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is a ban that individual local governments are responsible for issuing under the Bush Fires Regulations 1954 Section 38A, and/or Section 24C.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by City of Kalamunda and are put in place when the Chief Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities. A Harvest and vehicle Movement Ban may be issued at any time of the day.

It is the responsibility as a property owner or resident to be aware of any bans in place before undertaking an agricultural activity including harvesting as you could be fined. But more seriously, you would be responsible for putting your property, family and community in danger

A Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban can be in place for any length of time. It is most likely to be imposed during the 'heat of the day'. The City can extend or cancel this at any time if weather conditions change.

## **Alternate Options to Burning**

#### Skip Bins

City of Kalamunda residents can select from either a general waste skip bin (blue) or green waste skip bin (green). Households are entitled to any combination of up to three skip bins per financial year (excludes commercial and industrial premises). Both the general and green waste skip bins are three (3) cubic metres.

Households that meet the following criteria can are entitled to an additional green waste bin(s) only to assist with bush fire management.

- One (1) additional green waste bin is available for properties between 2000m2 – 5000m2
- Two (2) additional green waste bins are available for properties over 5000m2

The green waste from the green skip bins is mulched and reused, reducing the amount

## Appendix D: FAQ's

## Frequently Asked Questions – to be uploaded onto Engagement HQ

Why this is important: Bushfires have the capacity to strike without warning and provided with the right environmental conditions, can quickly exceed firefighting resources. This event greatly impacts community, properties, homes and infrastructure, while posing great risk to human life. It is for this reason, that it is imperative that both the wider community, households and individuals are supported and informed of bushfire preparedness, awareness and survival planning. This is crucial for the City of Kalamunda to protect life, livelihood, property and community.

Why do I have to prepare my property: It is important that individuals do not assume that the City will be wholly responsible for hazard preparedness and mitigation for each home? Our homes and our families are our personal responsibility to prepare keep safe in emergency situations.

Each one of us must take personal responsibility for our property and the safety of our family. It is critically important to understand that fire authorities will be working hard to stop the fire front and therefore may not be able to protect individual homes during a bushfire. To protect your home this fire season, you must prepare your property, a little work each month of the year will also help to prepare and protect it from other natural hazards such as storms.

It is very important for each of us to have a bushfire survival plan, understand that we are at risk, accept our personal responsibility to prepare and protect our homes and family, stay informed, and be self-reliant. This is critical to ensure self-protection during bushfires and to support the protective services provided by local and career fire services.
