

Course Overview

SHB20116 The Certificate II in Retail Cosmetics is a nationally recognised qualification under the Hairdressing and Beauty Services Training package (SHB).

This qualification has been designed for those individuals who wish to be employed in a retail sales position involved in a range of tasks to sell and demonstrate beauty or cosmetic products, following routines and procedures and working under direct supervision. This qualification provides a pathway to work as a retail sales consultant in any business that sells beauty or cosmetic products and services. This can include retail outlets such as cosmetic counters, department stores/pharmacies or beauty and hairdressing salons. These individuals possess a range of well-developed technical and customer service skills where discretion and judgement is required and are responsible for their own outputs. This includes client consultation, retailing skills and application of make-up services.

SHB20116 The Certificate II in Retail Cosmetics may also be utilised as a stepping stone to higher qualifications. Suggested qualifications include SHB30215 Certificate III in Make-up, CUA51015 Diploma of Screen and Media – Specialist Make-up Services, SHB30115 Certificate III in Beauty Services and SHB40115 Certificate IV in Beauty Therapy



Course Duration

Part Time 1 day per week or 2 evenings per week – 9 weeks.

Tuition Cost Payment Options

Payment In Full \$1,450: \$300 deposit on enrolment balance paid prior to commencement.

Payment Plan \$1,550: \$300 deposit on enrolment balance \$312.50 direct deposit four fortnightly payments.

Student Requirements

Uniforms: WA Academy uniform top to be worn with black professional pants and enclosed black shoes.

Portfolio: WA Academy utilises in some units portfolios, assignments and log books to allow formative assessment through the duration of the qualification. These are completed outside of class and at the student's cost.
